#### Description

LSC was originally retained by the Park City Municipal Corporation to develop a long-range transportation plan for the community, focusing on the transportation needs of the 2002 Winter Olympics (held partially in Park City). This long-range transportation plan focused on the existing public transportation program providing service within the city, as well as to encourage the growth of regional public transit services throughout the Wasatch Front. A key element of this strategy was the development of an Old Town Intermodal Center adjacent to Park City's historic Old Town visitor district.

LSC was subsequently retained to conduct a planning and design feasibility analysis for the center, as well as to provide transportation engineering assistance with regard to the final design of the center. As part of these subsequent studies, LSC developed a program for the project, identifying the required square footage of the building, passenger amenities, and the number of bus spaces. LSC then developed a series of eight alternative site plans for the project, considering factors such as impact on parking, traffic access, pedestrian access, urban design issues, impact on existing topography, and impact on the historic district. In addition, examples of potential architecture for the transit center building were developed. These concepts were presented and refined through a series of meetings with a Downtown Task Force, comprised of members of the City Council, Planning Commission, and Historic District Commission. Through this process the consulting team and the Task Force refined the alternatives and developed a recommended program and site plan for the Intermodal Center. This recommended plan was subsequently adopted by the Planning Commission and City Council. Construction of the project was completed in 2001, and the project received the 2001 Envision Utah Grand Achievement in Planning and Implementation Award.
