**Description**

The Colorado Department of Transportation is responsible for developing the State Long-Range Transportation Plan. Colorado has been divided into 15 Transportation Planning Regions and each Region prepares a 20-year Regional Transportation Plan which is then incorporated into the state plan. LSC was selected to prepare the Intermountain Region Transportation Plan which includes Eagle, Garfield, Lake, Pitkin, and Summit Counties. This region is one of the fastest growing areas in Colorado and includes the resort areas of Summit County (Breckenridge, Keystone, A-Basin, and Copper Mountain), Vail and Avon-Beaver Creek, and Aspen.

LSC worked with the Regional Planning Commission to develop goals and project evaluation criteria which were then used to evaluate transportation system alternatives and prioritize the improvements. A regional model was developed to project future transportation demand and levels of service. A multimodal transportation plan was prepared which includes significant bicycle, pedestrian, transit, and highway improvements. The plan also includes improvements for the region's five airports. The plan's recommendations provide priorities for making the transportation system improvements for all modes of transportation with a strong emphasis on alternate modes of transportation.

LSC is currently involved in the 2035 Statewide Planning Update and is completing the 2035 Intermountain Regional Transportation Plan Update.
